

Role-Naming Framework

International Youth Council on Gender Equality

Objective:

The role-naming system within the International Youth Council on Gender Equality (IYCGE) is designed to uphold transparency, integrity, professionalism, and consistency across all departments and regions. Clear and standardized titles ensure that every member understands their responsibilities and that our organizational structure remains internationally coherent.

The International Youth Council on Gender Equality is structured into various levels:

1. Executive Chairperson
2. Ambassadors
3. Directors
4. Fellows
5. Interns
6. Administrators

Single Roles:

All single-role titles follow a consistent structure:

Role Title, Department / Country

Examples:

- Chairperson, Board of Directors
- Director, Diversity, Equity & Inclusion
- Ambassador, Democratic Republic of the Congo
- Government Relations Fellow, United States of America

Holding Multiple Positions

Members may hold two positions simultaneously, but they must commit fully to the responsibilities of both. When listing these positions professionally (e.g., LinkedIn or a resume), individuals may choose:

- Two independent entries (each with its own responsibilities), or
- One combined entry that integrates both roles.

Combining Two Roles

If a member chooses to list two roles together in one line, the formatting must follow rules:

- Do not place a comma in the ambassador title.

- **Correct:** Ambassador of Sweden & Lead, Economy and Gender Task Force
- **Incorrect:** Ambassador, Sweden & Lead, Economy and Gender Task Force

ROLE-NAMING FRAMEWORK

- Do NOT use the word “and” in between two roles. Always use the & symbol when connecting two titles.

Department and Country Titles Must Remain Separate. When combining roles, one may be country-based and the other may be department-based, but each title must still independently follow the single-comma rule.

This means members should NOT list a combined role such as:

Ambassador, South Africa and Chair, African Continental Council

Instead, roles should appear separately or be integrated in a way that follows our structure.

Ambassador of South Africa & Chair, African Continental Council

Correct Formatting Examples

One Role

- Ambassador, United Kingdom
- Public Advocacy Fellow, Malawi

Two Roles

- Ambassador of Lebanon & Head, Reproductive Rights Task Force
- Ambassador of Brazil & Chair, South American Continental Council
